

This thesis deals with the problem that Internet contents can be regarded worldwide as „Internet Crimes“. In Germany warnings about „Nazis on the Net“ become more urgent while German content providers are afraid of foreign prosecution authorities. Whether however these developments can be stopped by an international solution, appears questionable. Therefore the author examines the culpability of Internet contents in the worldwide context. The past efforts toward an international solution are represented and their chances of success are verified. It shows up that national solutions should not be ignored rashly.
